
GETTING TO GOLDEN

Take care of yourself and others as you travel to Golden, British Columbia.



Travelling to Golden

- Proper preparation can help you navigate any unforeseen events while travelling. For long-distance travel, perform any necessary car maintenance. Make sure your car has all the proper safety equipment and an emergency roadside kit at all times.
- Check <u>DriveBC</u> & <u>Alberta 511</u> for road conditions and construction. Additionally, check the <u>Kicking Horse</u> <u>Canyon Project Calendar</u> and plan appropriate journey times.
- During peak months the roads are shared with visitors not familiar with the area so be patient and vigilant.
- Use <u>Tour the Golden Triangle</u> as a resource for suggested itineraries and idea generation for roadside stops and attractions.
- When driving in the winter, drive according to conditions. Before you go, check route conditions, pack essentials and equip your car with appropriate <u>tires as</u> <u>per the provincial legal requirements</u>.

In and around Golden

- When you arrive in Golden, make sure to respect speed limits within the community. Stay alert for hazards including wildlife. Pay attention to signage and camp only in designated locations.
- Keep motorized vehicle noise to a minimum and share the road with cyclists and pedestrians.
